Finally, we have a great collection of Super8 films from the late 70s to the early 90s, documenting New York City, Batavia, and France through the eyes of John Coburn, Judy Blankenship and Barbara Sternberg.

This year, we have three exciting workshops: Film Collage with Jake Parker Scott, Experimental Filmmaking with Phil Hoffman and Franci Duran, and Phonotropes with Jennifer Linton. These workshops use archival film, fresh film, no film at all. One brings us back to the origins of motion picture through proto-cinematic devices.

Experimental Filmmaking with Found Footage

Participants will repurpose and rework existing Super8 and 8mm film using a variety of tactile analogue techniques including: painting, drawing, scratching, tinting and toning, bleaching, collaging, contact printing onto 16mm film and processing using conventional and eco- chemistries. No previous experience is necessary.

Artist Bios:

Francisca Duran

Francisca Duran is a Chilean-Canadian experimental media artist who creates films, video installations, and 2D, photo-based, mixed-media works about history, memory, power and violence. Duran has exhibited internationally at film festivals and venues including International Film Festival at Rotterdam, HotDocs, Arkipel, Edinburgh International Film Festival, Kassel DOKFest, Los Angeles Film Forum, John Hansard Gallery and VideoPool Gallery. Duran holds an M.F.A. from York University and a B.A.H. from Queen's University and she continues to receive professional development from artist-run centres. Her practice has been supported by research, travel, and production grants from the Canada Council for the Arts, the Ontario Arts Council, and the Toronto Arts Council. https://www.franciduran.art/

Philip Hoffman

Philip Hoffman was born in Kitchener-Waterloo, Ontario, from families of European immigrant-settlers who came to Canada (Winnipeg/paternal and Kapuskasing/maternal) in the 1920's. Hoffman's filmmaking began with his boyhood interest in photography. As semi-official historian of family life, he became intrigued by questions of reality in photography and later in cinema. After completing his formal education which includes a Diploma in Media Arts at Sheridan College and a Bachelor of Arts in Literature at Wilfrid Laurier University, Hoffman began working on his films, as well as teaching film, electronic and computer-based media in the Media Arts Program at Sheridan College. Learn about pre-cinema animation devices such as thaumatropes and zoetropes, and then apply the techniques covered in this workshop to make your own physical animation devices on paper. This workshop will focus on the creation of phonotropes; paper discs that, when rotated on a record turntable, activate looping animations that are drawn directly onto the disc. Once mastered, this simple technique has a multitude of different variants and creative applications. No animation experience necessary.

Her professional art practice spans thirty years and includes media explorations into drawing, printmaking, installation and animation. 





Deviations: A Retrospective of Small Gauge Films by Wrik Mead

Emerging from Toronto's experimental film scene of the 1980s, Wrik Mead's films have been internationally celebrated. Working across film, video, installation and print, the goal of this program is to explore a very specific small-gauge corner of his filmmaking practice. In the 1980s he began working in Super-8 and although he would continue to shoot on the format his exhibition prints were blown up to 16mm to allow for more screening opportunities into the 1990s.

The films collected in this program are invitations to immerse yourself in a richly textured transgressive cinematic world. One that vacillates from the deeply personal to the undeniably political and quite often at the same time. Winding from his earliest experiments such as *What Isabelle Wants* (1987) to more complex projects like *frostbite* (1996) this program sees Mead returning to themes of restriction and catharsis, sexuality and longing for connection all the while refining his poetic images through hypnotic soundscapes, pixilation and distortion.

There are many motifs and similarities that crop up throughout these 11 films. This is most clear between *Warm* (1992) and *Closet Case* (1995) - on a surface level they follow the same beats. An anonymous naked male form struggles to remain upright in an inhospitable locale but despite these similarities the difference is in the root of the conflicts. Warm sees the struggle to find and accept comfort while the latter explores external

pressures and the need for self-actualization to survive in the face of adversity.

His boldness is emblematic of the underground queer community that Mead has been an active member of since his early days at OCA. It's important to remember that these early works were made during the height of the AIDS crisis. And although his work routinely digs into the darker elements of the human condition there is a vivid joyfulness throughout his work. We see it most obviously in *Hand Job* (2001), *Gravity* (1987), *cupid* (1998), even *Haven* (1992) which is also the most direct in its politics. His playfulness extends to the materiality of his choice of film and his preoccupation with pixilation. A technique in which actors' movements shift ever so slightly and are captured frame by frame. Resulting in a jittery uncanny effect. Pioneered by the likes of NFB animators Grant Munro and Norman McLaren, it was most famously used in the Academy Award winning short *Neighbours* (1952). This technique has come to define much of Mead's work.

Wrik Mead's films are deeply felt, emotional and subversive. With that in mind, *Deviations* as a program is unique for the 8-Fest as it subverts our own audience expectation with *Deviate* (1992) being shown digitally.

Wrik Mead

"Known internationally for his short animations that follow the smoke of Genet's Un chant d' amour, through endless poetic circles and spirals of desire. Mead's corpus signifies the resilience and seduction of queer culture as it navigates the gaps in mainstream culture." (curator Mark Waugh)

In 2013, he launched his first UK solo show, an installation titled *Draw the Line*, at PayneShurvell Gallery in London. His most recent films, *Outcognito* and *Broken Relationship*, have won awards at the 57th Ann Arbor Film Festival and the 40th Black Maria Film Festival.

In 2005, Wrik received his MA Fine Arts at Goldsmiths, University of London. He currently lives in Toronto and teaches in the Experimental Animation Department at OCAD University.







Places, Observations & Vignettes (POVs), shows three distinct voices from a professional artist to a documentary photographer and an experimental filmmaker. Spanning from the early 1970s to the late 1990s, these Super 8 films have never been publicly viewed in their entirety until now. Themes of time, cycles and destruction, portended or literal, are evident in these films. Artist John Coburn's New York City takes us on a journey through the iconic city with curious eyes and whose sharp attention and deep affection of Manhattan would later help define his career. Documentary photographer and writer Judy Blankenship's critical lens of the devastation of downtown Batavia, New York, has echoes to present conservation concerns, particularly in Toronto. Experimental filmmaker Barbara Sternberg's passage through the elements takes the universal subject of water, fire and air and transforms them into poetic visions of place. POVs bring old work into new contexts, highlighting the point of views of visions within Super 8.

Artist Bios:

Judy Blankenship

Judy Blankenship is an award-winning documentary photographer, writer and editor who lived many years in Canada and Latin America before settling in Portland, Oregon in the 1990s. Since 2005 she has lived half a year in Ecuador, where she has created a community archive with the indigenous Cañari community. Her photographs are in the collections of the national museums and libraries of Costa Rica and Ecuador, and her archive of photographs, videos and oral histories of the Cañari culture will be housed at the University of Texas, Austin.

John Coburn

John Coburn is a Canadian artist based in Toronto. He is best known for his pen & ink line drawings & bold oil on canvas paintings. Coburn's work is represented by Beckett Fine Art (Hamilton), Gagne Contemporary (Toronto/New York), and Sybil Frank Gallery (Prince Edward County). John can often be spotted working on location in big cities around the world. He has had exhibitions in London, New York, Toronto, Hamilton, and Tokyo.

Barbara Sternberg

Toronto filmmaker Barbara Sternberg has been making films since the mid-seventies. Her work has screened widely across North America and Europe including at MoMA, NY., Centre George Pompidou, Albright-Knox Gallery, and n.ow.here, in the UK. Her work is also featured in the permanent collections of the Art Gallery of Ontario and the National Gallery of Canada. Sternberg taught at York University, wrote the column "On (Experimental) Film" for Cinema Canada, was an organizer of the International Experimental Film Congress (May 1989), and is a founding member of Pleasure Dome Artists' Film Exhibition Group and AfFA (Artists for Film Art). She has been the visiting artist at a number of Canadian universities as well as the Université d'Avignon and the School of the Art Institute of Chicago. She works in other media, including video, performance and installation. Sternberg was a recipient of the Governor General's Award in Visual and Media Arts in 2011.

Curator Bio:

Rennie Taylor

Rennie Taylor is a multidisciplinary artist based in Montréal and Toronto. His practice focuses on the everyday with an emphasis on nostalgic signs and symbols found in popular culture. Engaging in the practices of photography, filmmaking and collage, he explores themes of consumerism, the handmade and obsolescence. He investigates decay within technology which corresponds to his material manipulation of celluloid, ephemera and found objects. His short experimental Super 8 films and videos have been shown internationally and nationally. He received his BFA with Distinction in Photography at Toronto Metropolitan University and a Ontario College Diploma in Fine Arts at Centennial College. Rennie previously served as a board member at the8fest Small Gauge Film Festival and is currently involved with the artist collective [UN]PROMPTU.

In a world where Grand Gestures (with a capital G), such as going into space, are celebrated in Grand Media, can a small gesture like collecting insect corpses serve as a point of displacement? This selection of films, made by artist-cineastes (with small a-c) from various corners of Brazil, provides fragmented time-space to celebrate small in-situ gestures. A ritual call to ancestry, nature-culture appropriated/excavated from the skull of the Mother Earth, artist's own gesture of relating to the filmic material, ephemeral reincarnation of humans and non-humans. Most, if not all, of the works were revealed and revived by the artists themselves without institutional support.

All films in the program will be projected in their original format: super 8 film. They are unique copies by their nature. The presence of a projectionist is a crucial part of the experience. The program was made possible by a trusted network of artists offering their only children. Super 8 was, and still is, the perfect format for artists without commitment to the commercial circuit. Unlike larger gauges such as 16mm and 35mm, this small format did not go through censorship during the military dictatorship in Brazil because of its amateur (lowercase a) characteristic. It is pertinent to reflect on the artistic production in super 8 in Brazil of today, even more with the shadowy presence of Great Media/Capital Powers.







FROM CAPE TOWN TO SCARBOROUGH: Life Through the Immigrant's Eye

A large extended family gathers for outings in and around Cape Town in the late-1960s - early 1970s. The life of the Liliefeldt family, both before and after immigrating to Toronto, is captured in the home movies they shot. An earlier film made in Cape Town, South Africa in the mid-1950s contrasts with those of the family. Both films depict places and events around the city, played-out against something that is not so directly seen in the footage: apartheid. This context informs the scenes we see, which at the same time paradoxically record a vibrant cultural life and the often beautiful surroundings of the city.

Arriving in Toronto in 1973, the Liliefeldt family embraced life in Scarborough, participating in everything from skating at Nathan Phillips Square to visiting African Lion Safari. A series of landscape shots place the family's school, townhouse complex and church in the then wide-open vistas of north Scarborough. Images that show the period in which Toronto's multicultural self-image was largely created.

Louise Liliefeldt (who appears in the films of her family along with her brother Jeremy, and parents Rosalind and Peter) will be present, contributing to the narration.
